<b>7)</b> Complete the following passage with the correct verb tense (past simple, past continuous, past perfect, present perfect, passive voice, or conditional sentences).
"Mary Maloney (sit) in her armchair, peacefully waiting for her husband. He (not/arrive) yet, so she (decide) to pour herself a small drink. A few minutes later, Patrick (walk) into the room.
