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A Norway has not always been a rich country. Just 80 years ago Norwegians were emigrating to the USA in their thousands in search of a better life. The rise in oil prices in the 1970s changed all that. But Norway's success is not only the result of its huge reserves of oil. Other countries have had such riches and wasted them. It is also due to the Norwegians' natural way of administering their money and their strong work ethic.

B Also, the country is saving for the future. Every dollar earned from oil is put straight into what is now the world's biggest pension fund – worth over \$200 billion. The Mystery of the Somerton Man

A - Over time, many theories have emerged. Some suggest he was a spy involved in Cold War intelligence. Others think it was a tragic case of a lost love or secret relationship. In recent years, DNA technology has brought researchers closer to solving the mystery, and a possible identification was made in 2022 - but many questions remain unanswered.

B - The Somerton Man case continues to fascinate people around the world. It's not just a story of an unsolved death - it's a puzzle full of secrets, strange clues, and possible cover-ups. For young people interested in mystery, science, or history, it offers a real-life example of how the truth can sometimes stay out of reach.

C - So what makes the case so strange? To begin with, the number of odd details. The cause of death was never clearly identified - some experts believed it was poison, yet no traces were found. The coded message, found hidden inside a secret pocket, has never been fully deciphered. Additionally, a phone number written in the book led police to a woman who lived nearby, but she denied knowing the man - though some believe she was hiding the truth.

First Impressions

A However wrong they can be, first impressions are a necessary survival mechanism. Thousands of years ago they helped people decide how to react in potentially dangerous situations. That is still true today, although in most cases it is not a question of life and death. According to some, we can learn to read first impressions better. We can also learn to create more powerful first impressions. Professor Helen Trent, a specialist in interpersonal relations, has studied the practice of good communicators. "Research shows that people who can make others feel good about themselves are excellent at creating positive first impressions. We call these people "Powerful Communicators" or PCs.

B Many experts regard first impressions as a valuable instrument for interpreting people's behaviour. Should we really trust our first impressions? Scientist Alexander Todorov believes that very often our first impressions are wrong. When two people meet for the first time, physical impressions are immediate. Before they have a chance to say a word, their senses are in a state of great activity; they are picking up and storing information about each other. They register their appearance, their smell, their body language and how they are dressed at the very same time.

She made almost no eye contact and she didn't seem to listen to me. She even appeared to be uncomfortable while being with me." Six months later, they met again. "Caroline was a completely different person. She was warm, friendly and smiled a lot. When she told me that she had had personal problems two days before we first met, that explained everything. It taught me to be more careful about making assumptions about people based on first expressions."
